COURSE DESCRIPTION

This lab focuses on improving keyboarding speed and accuracy.

COURSE COMPETENCIES

Module 1: Improving Keying Performance

- Demonstrate improved keyboarding techniques.
- Demonstrate mastery of alphabetic keys.
- Key at a specified rate of speed.
- Key with a specified accuracy rate.

MINIMUM STANDARDS

- Students will establish individual speed and accuracy goals with the instructor.
- Students will practice timed writings to achieve individual speed goals.
- Students will practice timed writings to achieve at least a 90% accuracy goal.
- Students will be responsible for submitting weekly performance records (portfolio) on assigned dates.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS
