COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course covers the production of documents found in medical offices. The major focus is on productivity and excellence in medical document production.

COURSE COMPETENCIES

The following competencies are required in each of the five modules.

- Select and use appropriate general and specialty reference materials.
- Transcribe authentic medical dictation requiring concentration and listening skills.
- Edit medical reports to conform to AAMT style guidelines.
- Proofread and correct transcripts to produce error-free documents.
- Transcribe medical terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.

Module #1

- Apply dermatology, ophthalmology, and otorhinolaryngology terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.
- Key dermatology office notes, letters, and reports of varying complexity and format.

Module #2

- Apply pulmonology, cardiology, and gastroenterology terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.
- Transcribe physical examination, discharge summary, and radiology, pathology, and sigmoidoscopy reports.

Module #3

- Apply obstetrics, gynecology, urology, and nephrology terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.
- Transcribe labor and delivery and history and physical reports.

Module #4

- Apply orthopedic and neurology terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.
- Transcribe emergency room notes, discharge summary, and radiology reports

Module #5

- Apply hematology, oncology, and immunology terms correctly according to the content and purpose of the dictation.
- Transcribe chart summary, outpatient visit, and pathology and autopsy reports.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

All students are responsible for attaining competencies through completion of the following course requirements:

- Timed writings
- Completing assignments
- Correctly spelling, pronouncing, and defining medical terms
- Transcribing medical dictation in correct format

EVALUATION STRATEGIES/GRADING

- Medical document transcription is transcribed on a daily basis. The student will complete all of the documents for each module, and the instructor will choose one document from each specialty to grade. Each error counts off 2 points from a 100-point basis.
- Medical terminology quizzes will be given on each specialty. Each test will consist of 20 terms. Each error counts off 5 points from a 100-point basis.
- Each module counts 20 percent of the grade. The average of the five modules constitutes the final grade. An overall grade of 70 is required.
- Type at least 40 words per minute with 97 percent accuracy.
