COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course continues the development of the four basic language skills and the study of German culture.

COURSE COMPETENCIES

Module 1: Verbs

- Conjugate verbs in the simple past, past perfect and future tenses
- Give commands using the imperative
- Suggest possibility or politeness using the subjunctive
- Discuss elements of German culture

Module 2: Nouns and Pronouns

- Decline personal pronouns in the accusative, dative and genitive cases
- Decline reflexive pronouns in the accusative and dative cases
- Show possession using nouns
- Discuss elements of German culture

Module 3: Modifiers

- Decline adjectives and adverbs in the four cases
- Make comparisons with adjectives and adverbs
- Discuss elements of German culture

Module 4: Prepositions

- Give directions using prepositions
- Show location using prepositions
- Identify means of transportation using prepositions
- Discuss elements of German culture

Module 5: Word Order

- Transpose word order in subordinate clauses
- Place nouns and pronouns in proper order according to case
- Format direct and indirect questions
- Discuss elements of German culture
